### Homeownership

Almost **2,900** New Mexico families became homeowners in 2020. MFA provided **\$470 million** in mortgage loans and **\$19 million** in down payment assistance to help these families realize the dream of homeownership.

## **Housing Development**

Just over 1,100 rental apartments and single-family homes were constructed or rehabilitated in 2020. MFA provided \$88 million in funding through tax credit awards and an additional \$15 million in grants, loans and bonds to create this muchneeded affordable housing.

### **Rental Housing**

Approximately \$32.6 million in project-based rental assistance was distributed to 5,230 low-income households. In addition, MFA is also responsible for monitoring 20,233 rental units at 330 affordable apartment communities across the state to ensure that the properties are safe and well-maintained.

#### **Homelessness Assistance and Prevention**

Almost **6,000** people experiencing homelessness were sheltered and housed by MFA's nonprofit partners. MFA funding to those partners totaled just over **\$2 million**. Homelessness was prevented for **677** individuals who received **\$820,000** in MFA-funded rental assistance.

#### **Supportive Housing**

MFA provided rental housing cost assistance to more than 1,700 individuals with physical or mental disabilities to ensure that they remained securely housed. Total funding was \$2.1 million.

#### **Weatherization and Housing Rehabilitation**

Energy-efficiency upgrades and rehabilitation measures were installed in 775 homes using \$6.2 million in funding from MFA. Not only are these homes now warmer and safer, but the homeowners also have lower utility costs.
